ESOT Sandoz fellowship 1990

Sandoz offers a yearly grant of SF 40,000, covering travel expenses and living expenses for 1 year, to a postgraduate worker in the field of transplantation - either clinical, experimental, or both. The first grant was awarded in 1988.

The applicant has to submit a full curriculum vitae to the ESOT Council, as well as an outline (maximum 300 words) of the objectives of the planned stay at the study institution. This applica-

tion has to be signed by the head of the department/program where the applicant works and the head of the department/program where the stay will take place. Both heads have to be members of ESOT. The applicant does not necessarily have to be a member of ESOT.

The study has to be performed in a country other than the country in which the applicant is currently working and must be situated inside Europe. The grant is for 1 year only. The recipient of the fellowship will be required to submit a written report of his/her stay to the ESOT council within 6 months of completion of the fellowship.

The fellowship will be awarded in 1990 and must be begun before the end of the year. Applications should be submitted to the secretary of the society no later than 1 June 1989. The selection and final decision will be made by the Council.

Second International Conference on Graft Infiltrating Cells 14-16 September 1989 Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, USA

This meeting deals with a multidisciplinary approach to the mechanisms of cellular infiltration of tissues in association with transplant rejection, infection, autoimmune disease, and malignancy. The program will consist of invited presentations and abstract sessions. For more information contact:
